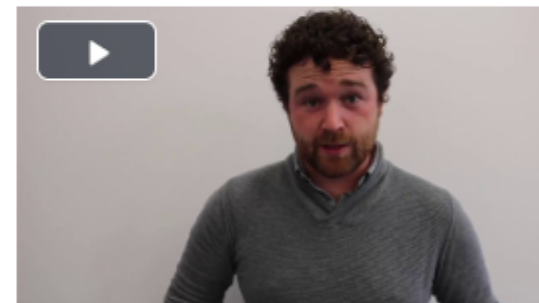

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GDPR and the Research Ethics Process

- Please note that the DCU Data Protection Unit provide guidance to staff and students regarding the processing of personal data and the University's approach to ensuring compliance with data protection legislation. Please refer to <https://www.dcu.ie/ocoo/dp/guides.shtml> for detail.
- Many elements of data protection are assessed during ethical review. If you intend to process personal data as part of your research proposal, then you must complete that section of the REC application form and attach a completed Personal Data Security Schedule (PDSS) for the project. The PDSS template and guidelines are accessible from the PDSS section of the [Data Protection Unit webpages](#). Your local GDPR champion can assist with specific queries on this. A copy of the finalized PDSS should be sent by the researcher to the Data Protection Unit (data.protection@dcu.ie)
- You will also need to include the relevant data protection information for potential participants in your Plain Language Statement [webpage](#)
